WASHINGTON, DC –The Alliance for Longevity Initiatives (A4LI) is pleased to announce the passage of Montana Senate Bill No. 422. The bill expands upon the Right to Try Act and will allow patients in Montana to access experimental drugs that have passed Phase I clinical trials but have not yet been approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

Introduced by Montana State Senator Kenneth Bogner, this bill removes restrictions on which patients are eligible to receive experimental medications and extends governmental immunity. The bill seeks to amend several sections of Montana's law, allowing a manufacturer of an investigational drug, biological product, or device to provide the treatment to an eligible patient who has requested it. This legislation requires that patients must have a terminal illness, have considered all other FDA-approved treatment options, have received a recommendation from their treating healthcare provider, and were given written informed consent for the use of the investigational drug, biological product, or device.

We at A4LI are honored to have had the opportunity to work alongside Senator Bogner in the creation of this bill. This victory is a testament to the dedication and hard work of our organization and our partners who share our mission of advancing legislation and policies that aim to expand access to therapies that have the potential to proactively increase healthy human lifespan.
